Overview:

The treatment of children with clefts requires a coordinated, multidisciplinary approach beginning at birth or before and continuing into adulthood and beyond. The ultimate goal of this treatment is an optimal result with minimal interventions. But what is "optimal"? How many interventions are acceptable to attain this ideal? How are patients able to access this ideal treatment plan?

The pre-conference symposium will begin by discussing the meaning of quality in cleft care. Various members of cleft and craniofacial teams will describe what quality means to them and how they strive to provide this quality for patients. We will also hear from the patient perspective. Once we understand quality of care, we will discuss access to this care.

Access to health care is a struggle for many patients and access to quality, multidisciplinary cleft care can be even more onerous. We will discuss the roadblocks to care that have arisen as well as the various approaches taken to solve these obstructions by various international teams and health systems.

The pre-conference symposium will conclude by analyzing the value of cleft care. While treating a patient with a cleft may be invaluable to a patient and patient's family, the stark reality remains that limited resources exist for this care. We will discuss the monetary and non-monetary factors that contribute to value as well as the overall burden of this care for the patient, the team and the health system.

Educational Objectives:

At the conclusion of the symposium, the attendee should:

1. Be able to identify the components of quality in cleft care in an effort to help them focus on these components when evaluating their own team's treatment strategies.

2. Begin to strike a balance between interventions that add to quality and those that begin to erode quality.

3. Understand the challenges of access to cleft care and glean solutions to these problems by relating to those steps taken by other teams.

4. Be able to calculate value as it pertains both to cleft care and to health care in general.

Cassandra Aspinall, MSW, ACSW, LICSW, is a Senior Social Worker in the Craniofacial Center at Seattle Children's Hospital. She is also a Clinical Assistant Professor at the University of Washington, School of Social Work in Seattle.

Craig Birgfeld, MD, is an associate professor at the University of Washington. He works primarily as a craniofacial surgeon at Seattle Children's Hospital where he also runs the Facial Reanimation team, and is the Craniofacial Fellowship director.

Cynthia H. Cassell, PhD; Division of Global Health Protection, Center for Global Health, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Atlanta, GA; University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill Craniofacial Center, Chapel Hill, NC; and Department of Maternal and Child Health, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, Chapel Hill, NC. Before coming to CDC in 2010, she was a recipient of a March of Dimes Basil O'Connor Starter Scholar Research Award for her work on health service use, costs, and access to care for children with birth defects. In 2012, she received the American Public Health Association Maternal and Child Health Section's Young Professional Award in recognition of her contributions and leadership in science, program, and policy relating to the health of women, children, and families. Her research has focused on health service use, costs, access to care, and outcomes of children with cleft and craniofacial birth defects.

Kathy Chapman, PhD, is a Professor in the Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders at the University of Utah, Salt Lake City, Utah. Her research focuses on describing the speech and language development of young children with cleft palate and assessment of speech outcomes. She is involved in the Americleft Speech Group and is the PI on a NIH-NIDCR funded study to compare speech outcomes across three centers in the US. Dr. Chapman has numerous data-based articles, book chapters, and national and international presentations related to these areas of study. She is a Fellow of the American-Speech-Language-Hearing Association.

Patricia Chibbaro, RN, MS, CPNP, received her BSN from the University of NY at Albany and her MSN/PNP from the University of Colorado. For the past 28 years, she has been the Pediatric Nurse Practitioner at the Institute of Reconstructive Plastic Surgery, NYU Langone Medical Center. She has been a member of the ACPA since 1992, the year that she received the Donna Pruzansky Memorial Fund Nursing Award. She has co-authored several book chapters on nursing care of the child with a cleft/craniofacial condition. Patricia is the host of The Nurse Practitioner Show on Doctor Radio, broadcast live on Sirius/XM Channel 110. Her greatest achievements are her 2 daughters, Marcella and Gabriella.

Sean P. Edwards, DDS, MD, FRCD(C), FACS received his dental degree from Dalhousie University in Halifax, Nova Scotia. He completed his medical degree and residency training at University of Michigan and his fellowship trainings at the University of Pittsburgh and the University of Michigan, where he has since remained as faculty. Dr. Edwards is the Chief of Pediatric Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at C.S. Mott Children's ospital and the residency program director. His research has focused on cleft and craniofacial care and sleep disorders, their genesis and treatment. Dr. Edwards serves on many committees, has served as a section editor for the International Journal of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, and reviews for many journals.

David Fitzsimons is a Speech Pathologist from the Cleft Palate Clinic at The Children's Hospital at Westmead in Sydney, Australia. Ross E. Long, Jr. DMD, MS, PhD, is currently Executive Director of the Lancaster Cleft Palate Clinic, Lancaster, PA, and also heads the Orthodontic and Research Divisions at that Clinic, a position he had had since 1977. He also holds faculty positions at the Hershey (PA) Medical Center of the Penn State University, Division of Plastic Surgery, and the Albert Einstein Medical Center, Dental/Orthodontic Division, Philadelphia, PA. He is a Diplomate of the American Board of Orthodontics, a past President of the American Cleft Palate-Craniofacial Association (ACPA) and past President of the 12th International Congress on Cleft Lip/Palate and Related Craniofacial Anomalies. He has been Head of ACPA's Americleft Project on Intercenter Collaborative Outcome Studies since 2006.

John G. Meara, MD, DMD, MBA is the Kletjian Professor of Global Surgery in the Department of Global Health and Social Medicine, Professor of Surgery at Harvard Medical School, Director of the Program in Global Surgery and Social Change at Harvard Medical School, Plastic Surgeon-in-Chief at Boston Children's Hospital, and Chair for the Lancet Commission on Global Surgery. He is also the Vice-Chair of the Health Policy Advisory Group for the American College of Surgeons. Since 2008, he has Co-Directed the Paul Farmer Global Surgery Fellowship program in collaboration with Partners In Health. Dr. Meara's interests are in the areas of craniofacial anomalies and cleft lip and palate, with a particular interest in augmenting the delivery of quality surgical care in low-resource settings.

Jonathan Sandy, PhD, MSc, BDS, is Dean of Faculty, Health Sciences and one of only two dental academics who are currently members of the Academy of Medical Sciences. He has been a keynote speaker at the last three quinquennial World International Orthodontic Conferences. Jonathan Sandy has published over 200 papers in peer-reviewed journals and co-authored three textbooks. He co-led the 1996 CSAG study which led to centralisation of cleft lip and palate services: the impact of this has just been reported. It demonstrated significant improvement in many cleft outcomes. His interests in education have been in the development of post-graduate training in orthodontics.

William Shaw, PhD, MScD, BDS graduated Glasgow 1968 and obtained further clinical and research qualifications prior to appointment as Head of Orthodontics at the University of Manchester in 1983, and subsequently Dean of Dentistry. He established the Cochrane Collaboration Oral Health Group, and a WHO Collaborating Centre for craniofacial anomalies. His clinical practice has been confined to children with cleft lip and palate since 1976 and his research with his wife, Gunvor, and other friends and colleagues includes several long term collaborative multinational projects sponsored by the European Union, and NIH randomised trials of cleft surgery.

Raymond Tse, MD, FRS(C), is an Associate Professor at the University of Washington and is one of four plastic surgeons at the Seattle Children's Hospital. He provides the majority of the surgical cleft care at his institution and has a specific clinical and research focus on care of children with cleft lip and palate. His research has ranged from the care of international adoptees with clefts to novel methods of assessing outcomes using Computer Vision combined with 3D imaging and Crowdsourcing.

Karen Wong is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Surgery at the University of Toronto, Canada. She is a Pediatric Plastic Surgeon-Scientist in the Division of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery at the Hospital for Sick Children. She is pursuing a PhD in Health Research Methodology at McMaster University with a focus in Health Services Research. Her research interest is in the measurement of patient-reported outcomes and the use of patient-reported outcomes data in quality improvement, and she is the co-developer of the CLEFT-Q.
